- Attend a half-day YAC orientation in Hays in August before school starts.
- Attend a monthly (1 hour) meeting during the school day in your home county in person or by zoom. Meeting location will rotate among schools.
- Attend a half-day YAC retreat in Hays in January.
- Actively participate in discussions and activities.
- Be an advocate for the YAC, the Heartland Community Foundation, and the youth in your community.
